RE: ICMA Connect

I am a member of the ICMA Digital Strategies Committee. One of the projects we are working on is the development of state level ICMA Connect networks. The goal is to pilot the state level ICMA Connect networks in four states (Arizona, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Utah). ICMA Connect is a platform that in some ways is similar to the email distribution listserve presently in service with MMANH using Google with some notable differences. The differences are as follows:

- 1. ICMA Connect would be managed by ICMA staff reducing the burden on MMANH staff/volunteers.
- 2. ICMA Connect has a shared library where documents could be kept. These might include some of the following examples,
 - a. Wage Studies and wage scale data
 - b. Policy examples and samples
 - c. Sample RFPs, RFQs, RFIs, etc...
 - d. Sample Contracts
 - e. Sample Agreement forms
 - f. Form templates for a variety of purposes
 - g. Job descriptions
 - h. Sample employment agreements
- 3. ICMA Connect has an announcements function that could be used for a variety of purposes.

The ICMA Connect state network for our organization would provide some capabilities that we do not presently have through the MMANH listserve. There are some potential downsides to consider as well.

- A. ICMA Connect users would have to be ICMA members. There is a cost to be a member of ICMA. There would not be any additional cost to participate in the ICMA Connect network. However, the membership dues structure has been changed by ICMA to lower the cost for members from smaller governmental entities. The new dues structure will be published in October 2022. Presently not all members of MMANH are ICMA members.
- B. If we choose to operate the present MMANH listserve and the NH ICMA Connect network we would likely be duplicating some efforts. Additionally, the list of users in each group may not all be the same. I would be concerned about operating two networks and dividing our organization.

I would propose that MMANH utilize the NH ICMA Connect network for our organization and discontinue the use of the MMANH listserve after a determined period of time that would allow all members of MMANH the time to obtain membership in ICMA. The enhancement in the level of service

provided over the present listserve is apparent. The reduction in cost for ICMA membership and the value of having more of the MMANH membership participating in ICMA would further enhance our profession.

If the MMANH membership concurs with transitioning to NH ICMA Connect I would take the steps necessary to develop the implementation plan and move the project forward to completion. Thank you for your consideration in this matter. I look forward to discussing this proposal further at the annual membership meeting in November.
