9:00 a.m. Brain Health and Mastering Communication During Change Presented by Jon Wortmann

The first step to being a better leader is you. Your brain health, the way in which you react in the most difficult moments, in many cases decides whether people trust you. The present historical moment is unsettled. We hear too much bad news. There is too much partisan attacking. It is completely normal for us to feel overwhelmed.

The good news for each of us as community leaders is that we can change the way we think and feel in response to the constant triggers. New brain science and organizational behavior research has unlocked what can keep you focused and calm, even happy, when other people around you melt.

This workshop will introduce you to the parts of the brain that cause stress and help you feel in control. Then, after a brain health assessment that reveals the simple things you can change to feel better, we will learn a technique called quick switching used by the best leaders in the military, professional sports, and executive leadership. We will finish the morning applying this technique to how we communicate with the most difficult people in our work and lives. With an awareness of what we can do differently in the face of our chaotic world, we will be ready for the situations that need our leadership.

Jon Wortmann is an executive and mental coach, minister, and speaker. A graduate of Harvard Divinity School, his books have been #1 best sellers in 22 categories on Amazon. He has trained dozens of towns and affiliate groups in addition to hundreds of public sector leaders to be strategic communicators and impactful leaders. He has trained the Mayors and Managers of Massachusetts six times and trains leaders yearly for Primex's emerging leaders course. He coaches mental skills for the UCONN men's golf and tennis teams in addition to professionals on the PGA and Web.com tours. When he has a free moment, he golfs. His favorite person in the world, his wife Jen, continues to golf with him semi-willingly on Sundays.

__Golf - Keene Country Club

The Keene Country Club golf course, designed by Wayne Stiles in 1923 and updated over time, offers constant challenge without undue punishment. The 18-hole course (par 72 for men and women) measures 6455 yards, a slope of 130 with an index of 71.5 from the back tees. This course, with its water, forest, hazards, bunkers and doglegs provides an interesting challenge for every level of play.

Hike - Gap Mountain Trail, Troy NH

Gap Mountain Trail is a 3 mile moderately trafficked out and back trail located near Troy, New Hampshire that features beautiful wild flowers and is rated as moderate. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, trail running, and birding and is best used from March until October.
